My Place in Time: Research of ancestry and creation of a “family tree”. Volunteers who are experts in the field of ancestry research and genealogy that will work directly with clients and their families to research the family roots, find important records and documents, and place information about that family into a “family tree”. Various components can be chosen by the family – the intention is to guide the family in doing the research and helping by providing guidance, training, and direction.



Reflections of My Life: Volunteers with various talents helping to collect and report on a client’s life in a variety of ways. This may be helping them record or report their memoirs, publish journals, thoughts, prayers or special memories/stories, writing a “life story”, recording collections of poetry, drawings, or other artistic renderings that illustrate “who” the client is - what they believed and how they lived.



My Treasured Moments: Collections of photographs and mementos – cards and clippings – assembled and presented in scrapbooks (either on paper or digitally) by family members with the assistance of volunteers who specialize in these hobbies. Collages, brochures, and digital reflections as additional ways to share these treasured memories.



My Legacy Video: Living testimonies, messages, stories, and even “old home videos” transitioned to new purpose through digital media. Volunteers will help the client (and even family and friends, if requested) compile special memories in video form that can be shared in a variety of venues. A DVD that the family is sure to treasure.
