### **No Regrets!**

"Eleven years ago I made a big transition. I left my lovely home of 25 years and moved to Raybrook Homes," said Rev. Harvey Kiekover. "I remember looking my sons in the eye and saying, 'I am giving you a gift."

What Harvey meant was that he was moving into a community that offered a continuum of care that would provide for all his needs as he grew older. "They understood and concurred. Reflecting on that move, Harvey says, "When I'm asked how I like living here, I can respond with conviction, 'I have no regrets; I feel blessed to be here!"

Born and raised on a farm, Harvey's life turned out to be radically different then he envisioned. He planned to take over the family farm near Drenthe, Michigan. He had no idea that the path the Lord had planned for him would include college, seminary, missionary service in Nigeria for the Christian Reformed Church, and ultimately 19 years as a chaplain for Holland Home. Harvey's life was also impacted by the care his beloved wife, Thelma, received as a patient in Raybrook skilled nursing for eight years. She had MS, and as her condition deteriorated, she needed nursing care. Harvey deeply appreciated the care she received. "She was on Medicaid for most of this period. Not once did Holland Home suggest that it was a financial burden. She passed away in 1996. Thelma was blessed to be cared for in a Christian home and our family was blessed in knowing her needs were met with loving care."

Harvey further stated, "Not only did my wife receive good care, but in my years as chaplain I also saw how much quality Christian care meant to residents and families." When asked why he gives to Holland Home, he responded, "I want this important ministry to continue for my generation and generations to come. My sons understand that the endowment fund I donate to and the planned gift commitment I have made are an investment in Holland Home's caring ministry."

### Holland Home's mission comes full circle for Mary Regan McNeil



"I am grateful to God that I am healthy and cognitively intact enough to enjoy my family."
